Our Goal in 2020: More Flights, More Access to Healthcare

Thanks to your support, Angel Flight West will fly more missions, helping more people get the care they need



With your help, Chance will receive treatment for renal failure at Lucile Packard Children's Hospital

With help from the generosity of donors like you, Angel Flight West had a remarkable year in 2019, flying 5,090 missions across 12 western states. This adds up to a total of nearly 10,000 hours in the air, covering over 660,000 miles!

While these numbers are impressive, it's the individual flights that mean the most for passengers like Whitney S., of Meridian, ID and Chance J. of McKinleyville, CA, two of many who faced obstacles that could have prevented them from receiving important medical care.

Fourteen-year-old Chance receives twice-monthly dialysis for end-stage renal failure at Stanford, a seven- to eight-hour drive from his home in McKinleyville, CA. Chance's family lost their home in 2018's Camp Fire, and had been making the long commute to Palo Alto for months before a valet at the hospital told them about AFW. When weather conditions kept our volunteer pilots from flying, Chance flew with AFW partner Contour Airlines, who generously donated tickets to make sure he got to the treatment he needed.

More Flights Continued...

Whitney was seven months old when she was diagnosed with a congenital defect called ALCAPA, affecting her heart and arteries, that required two surgeries and a two-month stay at Seattle Children's Hospital, 500 miles away from her home in Idaho. Now a year and a half, Whitney still needs treatment, but even with her father working as much overtime as he can to cover their bills, commercial flights can be prohibitively expensive. To complicate matters, the duplex the family was living in was recently sold, and they'll need to find a new place to live by the spring.

"To be honest," Whitney's father told us, "I don't know if we'll be able to recover financially from evwerything, but we are trying our hardest, and happy that Whitney is getting better! Angel Flight West is amazing, and we thank you from the bottom of our hearts!"

It is our mission to help patients like Whitney and Chance get the care they need by doing what we do best: flying them there! And thanks to your generous support, we'll be able to do just that!

Meet an AFW Pilot: Michael Burks, Montana Wing

And does he have any advice for pilots thinking about becoming AFW volunteers?

"I guarantee that if you sign up for just one mission a month, your outlook on life will change. Watching families battle life-threatening illnesses with a positive attitude will blindside you like nothing you've ever experienced. Some of these kids have gone through hours of poking, prodding, cutting, and testing. You can be having the worst day, but when you see a smile from one of them, all of that stress melts away."
