## Spotlight on an Angel Passenger Chance N.

Chance N. was born on March 1, 2012 in Las Vegas, NV. On April 13, 2015, he was diagnosed with stage IV liver cancer. He was three years old. His treatment would require long hospital stays during his chemotherapy and other procedures. His grandparents, Melisa and Ray, are his primary caregivers and oversee his medical care. Melisa is herself an 18-year survivor of cancer, and wanted to make sure that Chance had somebody by his side during all of his treatments.

Late in 2015, Chance's cancer had advanced despite chemotherapy. He was taken to UCLA Medical Center by air ambulance where he was evaluated for a liver transplant. On November 28, Chance received his liver transplant and began the long journey to recovery.

Once home, Melissa and Ray were faced with the need to get him to repeated and regular follow-up appointments. The family car was reliable enough to get around town, but not reliable enough

# **AFW** Joins Forces with Operation Freedom Paws

AFW is pleased to partner with the non-profit Operation Freedom Paws, an organization that matches dogs to a specific client's physical and psychological needs including traumatic stress syndrome that affects many military personnel like AFW passenger Scott M. They teach individuals to train their own dog, and certify them together as a service dog team. There is no charge, just a commitment to complete the 48-week training program. Most of the dogs come from rescue shelters and are carefully evaluated. Each is then matched to a specific client's physical and psychological needs. This special canine-human relationship helps patients get



Melisa says that without Angel Flight West they truly would not be able to make it to their appointments that are so crucial to Chance's health. Routine testing of Chance's new liver function and rejection monitoring are critical to his long-term prognosis.

Three-year-old Chance loves to fly on the Angel Flight planes, and especially when his pilots allow him to "fly" the plane! What a treat for this little boy who has already experienced more heartache than most of us do in a lifetime! #### **First Flight** Aria Davenport, So. CA Wing Command Pilot

So. CA Wing Command Pilot Aria Davenport got the flying bug sitting in the back seat while accompanying his grandfather on his flying lessons. On his 16th birthday, his grandfather told him that this time Aria would be in the front seat taking the lesson, and he hasn't stopped flying since.

When Aria graduated from Kent State's Professional Pilot Program in 2011, he knew he wanted to be a corporate, not commercial, pilot. One of the reasons is that he likes to get to know his passengers. So, when he was introduced to AFW and flew as Mission Assistant on his first mission on Sept. 2016 with So. CA Command Pilot Steve Danz, he was hooked.

Aria came to AFW through his uncle, who knew past AFW Executive Director Jim Weaver. Jim put Aria in touch with Steve Danz and Aria has flown as Steve's Mission Assistant many times. Remarking on a few camp missions he's flown, Aria says, "It breaks my heart to see these kids with cancer. When I was young, a lot of pilots inspired me and it feels good to be able to inspire these kids."

Aria's first "official" mission as So. CA Wing Command Pilot was on February 16th for Jocelyn M. from Santa Maria, CA to Santa Monica. What was
